

RESOLUTION NO. 1655

WHEREAS, a petition for the formation of the Lacey Protection Fire District was duly received by the Board of County Commissioners of Thurston County on the 31st day of January, 1949, with the certificate of sufficiency of the Thurston County Auditor attached thereto showing a sufficient number of signatures of qualified registered electors resident within the boundaries of such district as described therein; And

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 1647 dated the 31st day of January, 1949, Monday, February 21, 1949 at ten o'clock A. M. was fixed as the day and hour for a public hearing on said petition; And

WHEREAS, such hearing was duly and regularly held relative to the formation of said district and the inclusion therein of the lands described in said petition, and, it appearing to the Board of County Commissioners of Thurston County that said area of Thurston County will be benefited by the formation of said district and such district will be conducive to the public safety, welfare and convenience, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that because of the public safety and welfare involved, said Board of County Commissioners of Thurston County do hereby find in favor of said petition and that an election be held on April 2, 1949, for the purpose of determining whether or not the district shall be organized as a fire protection district, pursuant to the laws of the State of Washington, and for the purpose of the election of its first fire commissioners, said district to be known as the Lacey Fire Protection District, with the following boundaries, to-wit:

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Beginning at the south one-quarter corner of Sec. 1, T. 18, N.R. 2 W., W.M., thence east six and one-half miles to the southeast corner of Sec. 1, T. 18 N. R. 1 W., W.M., thence north one mile to the northeast corner of Sec. 1, thence east one and one-half miles, more or less, to the Nisqually River, thence southeasterly following the course of the Nisqually River through Sections 5 and 8, in T. 18 N. R. 1 E., W.M., to an intersection with the east line of Sec. 8, thence south one and one-half miles, more or less, to the southeast corner of Sec. 17, thence west one-half mile to the south one-quarter corner of Sec. 17, thence south one mile to the south one-quarter corner of Sec. 20, thence west one-half mile to the southwest corner of Sec. 20, thence south one mile to the southeast corner of Sec. 30, thence west one mile to the southwest corner of Sec. 30, thence south two miles along the range line to the southeast corner of Sec. 1, T. 17 N.R. 1 W., W.M., thence west three miles to the southwest corner of Sec. 3, thence north one-half mile to the west one-quarter corner of Sec. 3, thence west one mile to the west one-quarter corner of Sec. 3, thence north one-half mile to the northwest corner of Sec. 4, thence west along the township line two miles to the southwest corner of Sec. 31, T. 18 N. R. 1 W., W.M., thence north along the range line one mile to the northeast corner of Sec. 36, T. 18 N., R. 2 W., W.M., thence west one-half mile to the south one-quarter corner of Sec. 35, thence north one mile to the north one-quarter corner of Sec. 25, and an intersection with the corporate limits of Olympia, thence in a general northerly direction following the easterly corporate limits of Olympia to the south one-quarter corner of Sec. 1, T. 18, N.R. 2 W., W.M., and the beginning of this description.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that ^{the} following resident electors of said district be named as the candidates for the election of said fire commissioners of said district, namely, Robert Christensen,
A. G. Homan and Emil Johnson.
